

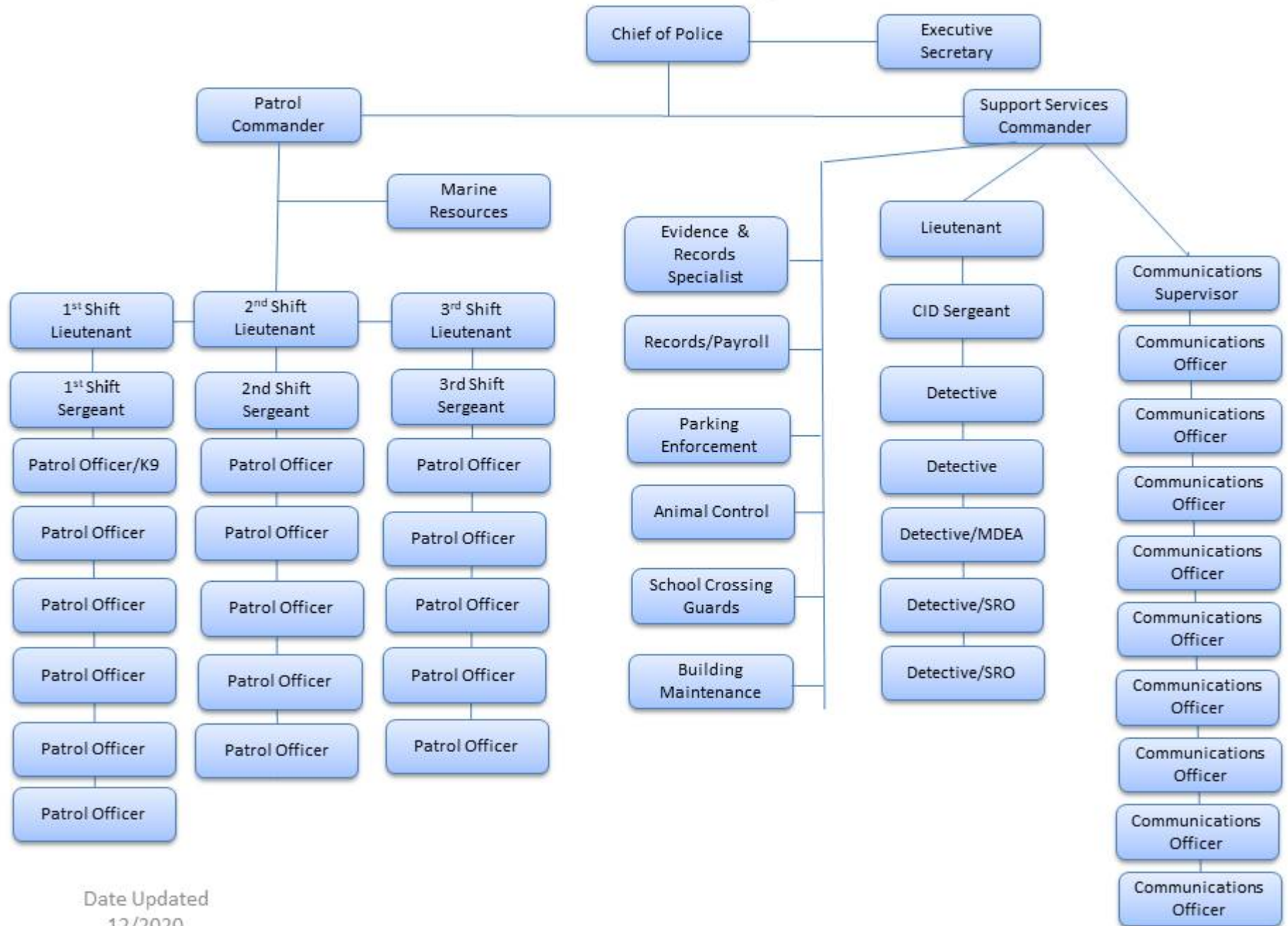

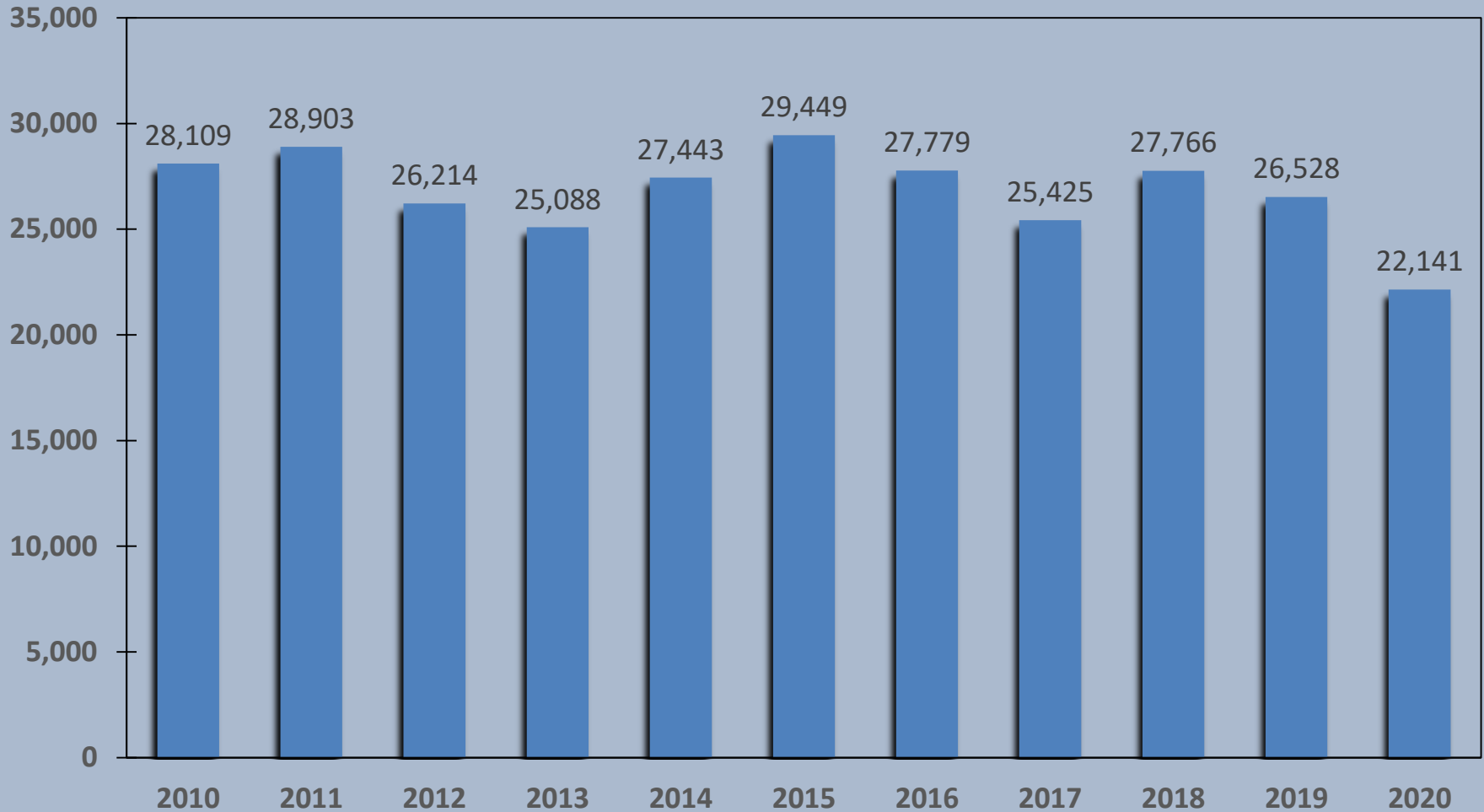

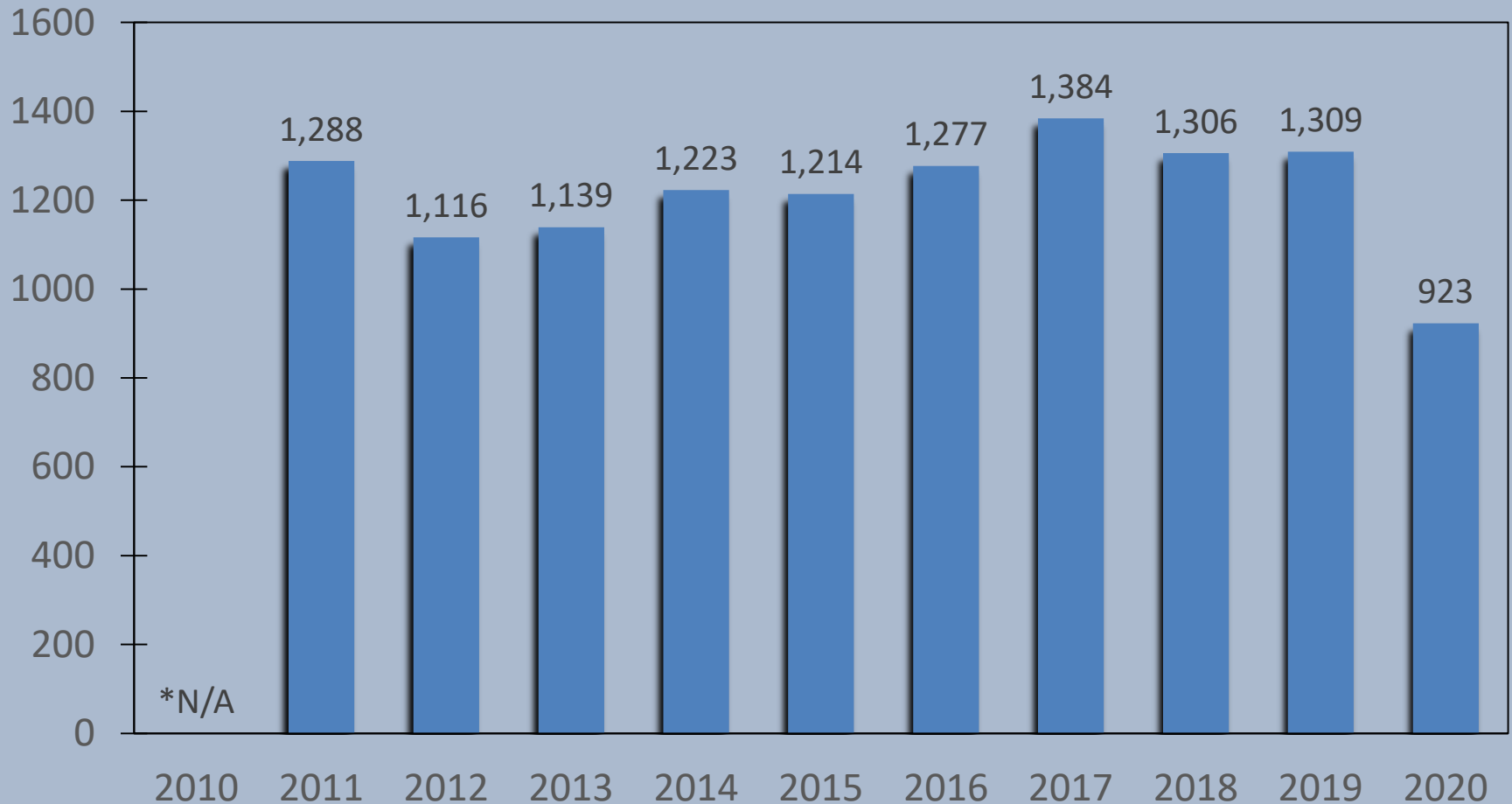

Motor Vehicle Crashes

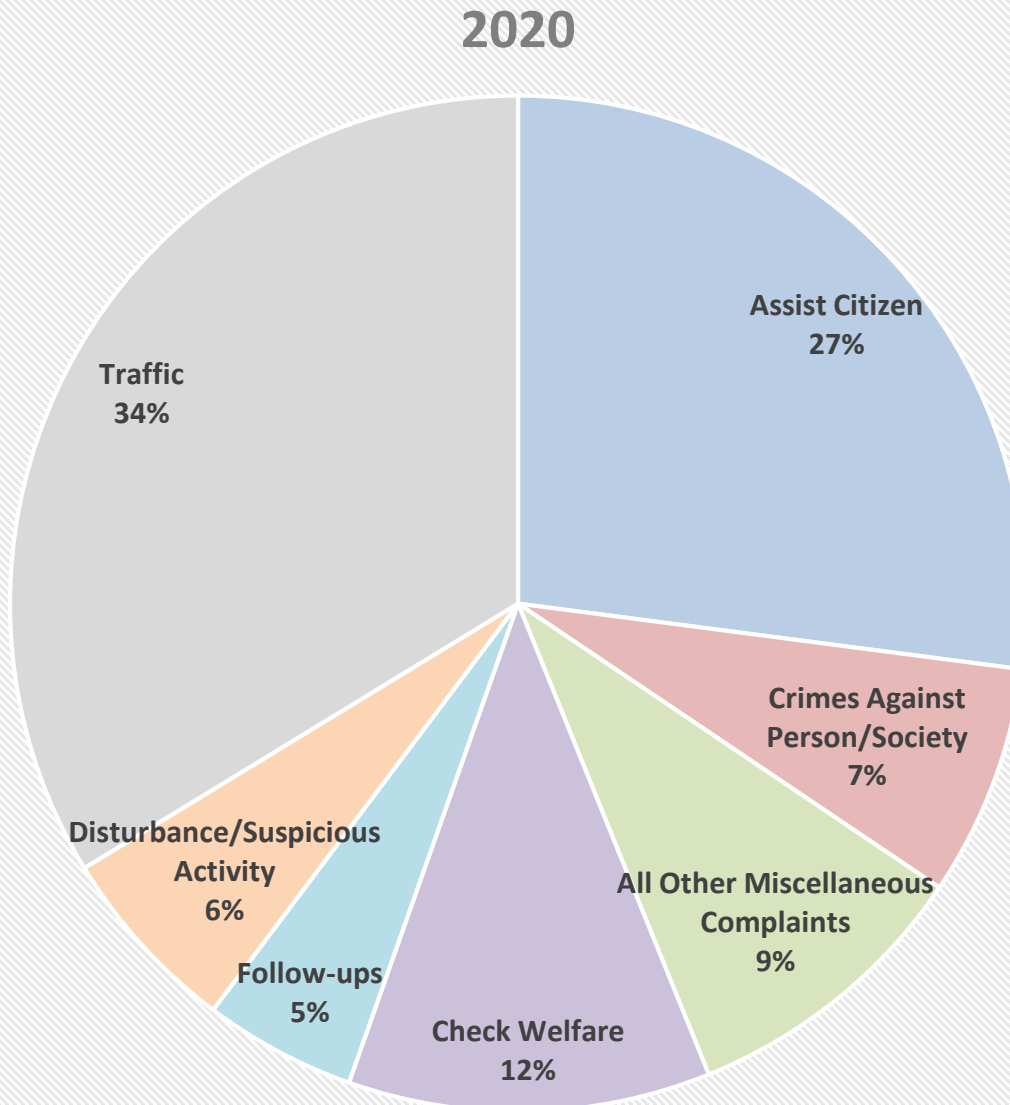

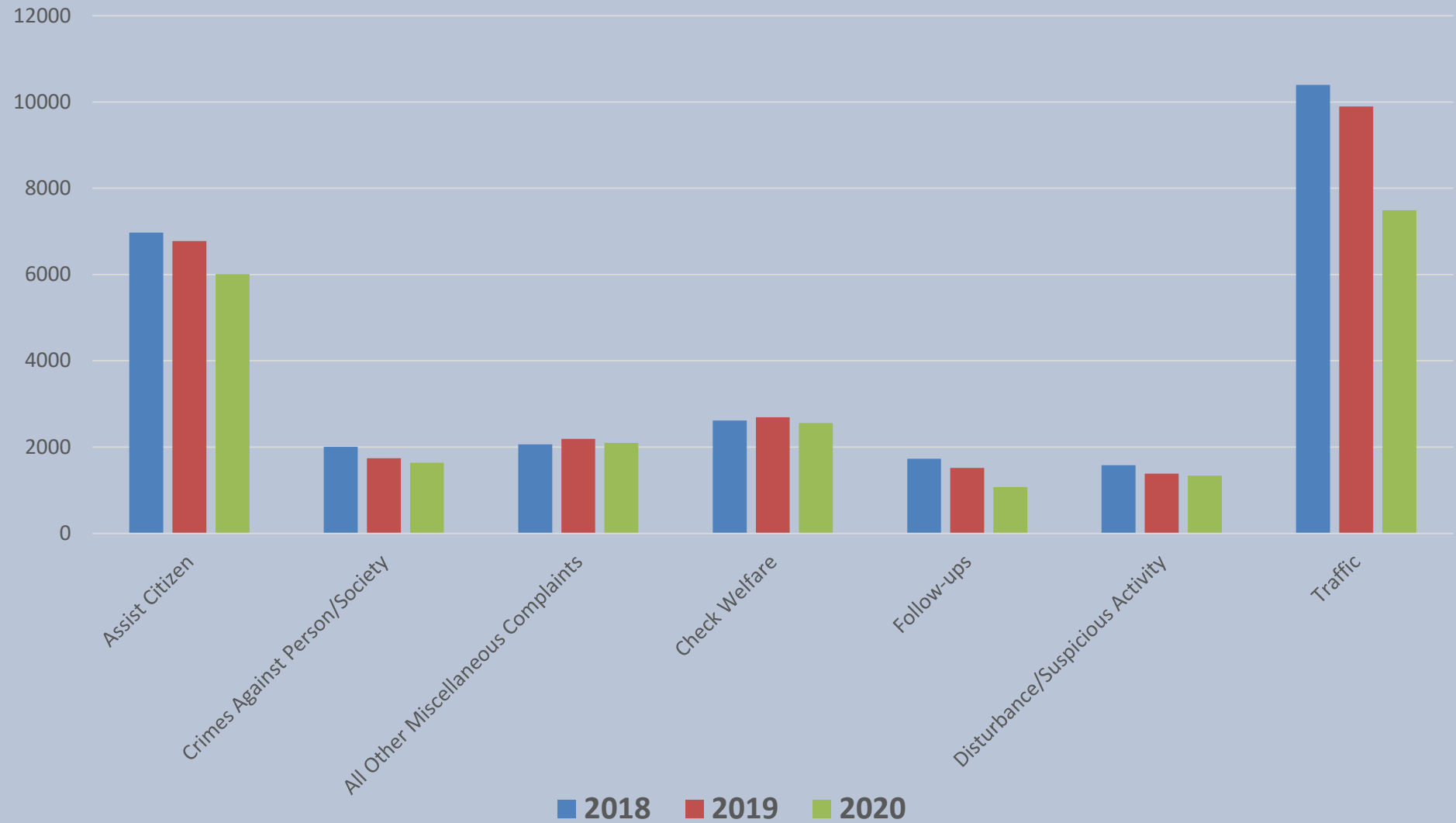


2020 Calls for Service



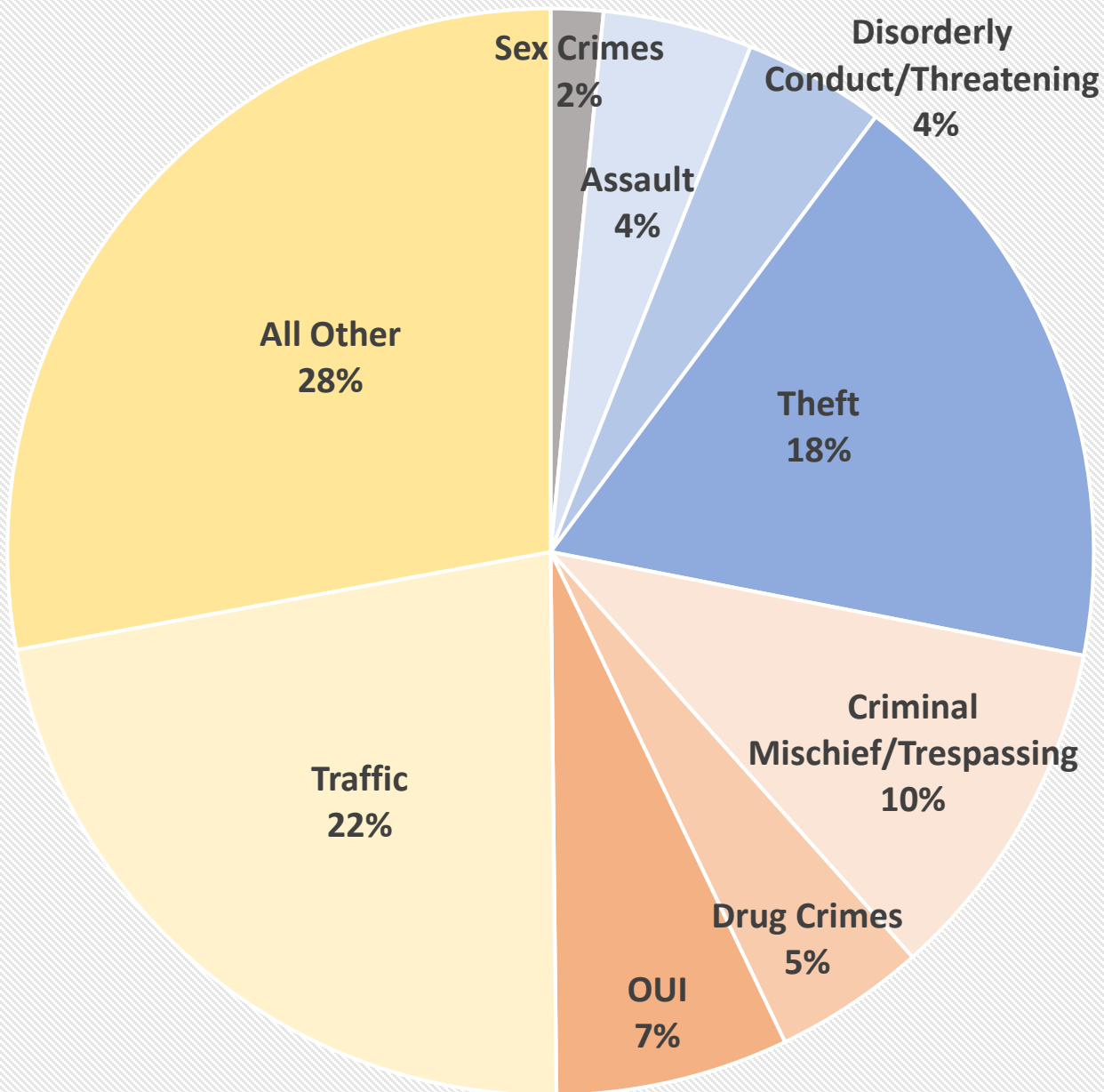


2018-2020 Calls for Service





2020 Offenses and Arrests

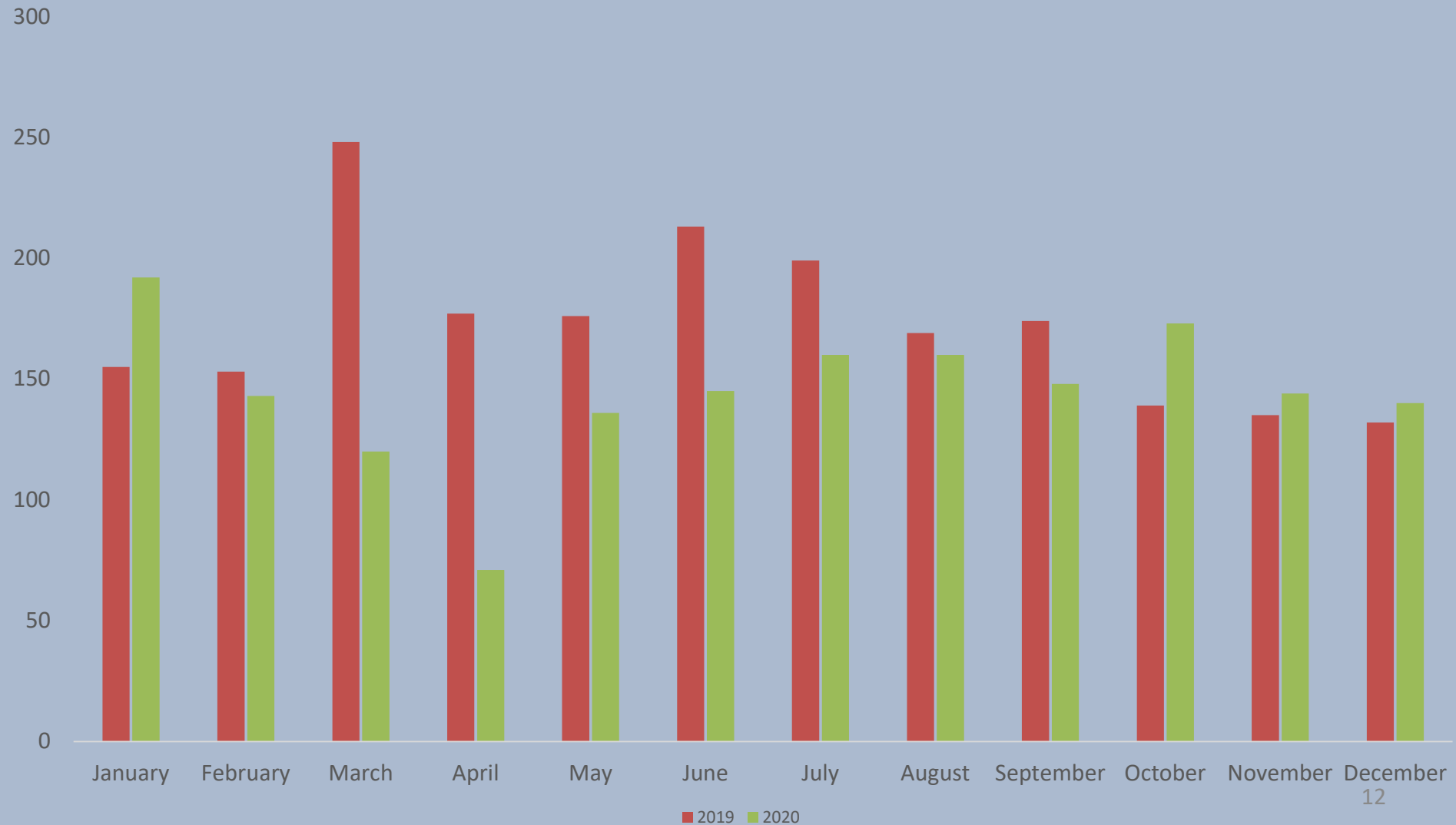




2019/2020 Activity by Month

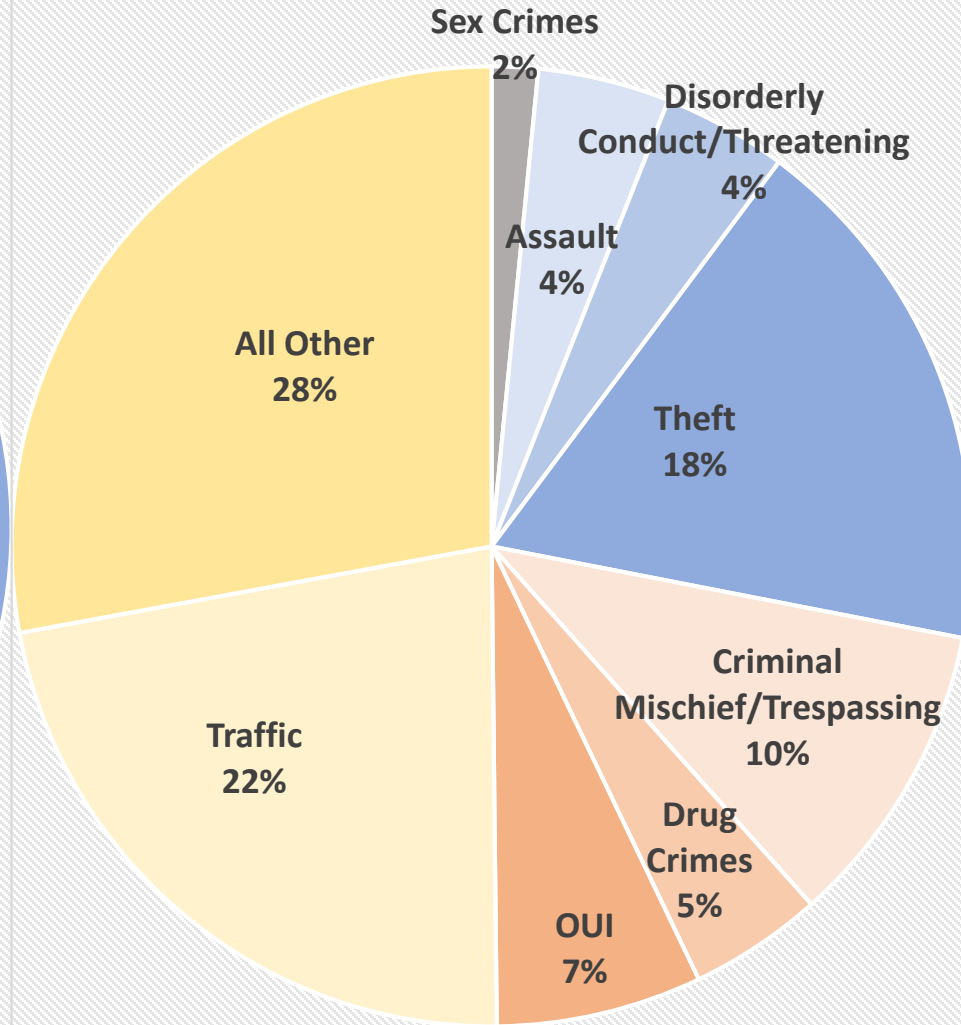
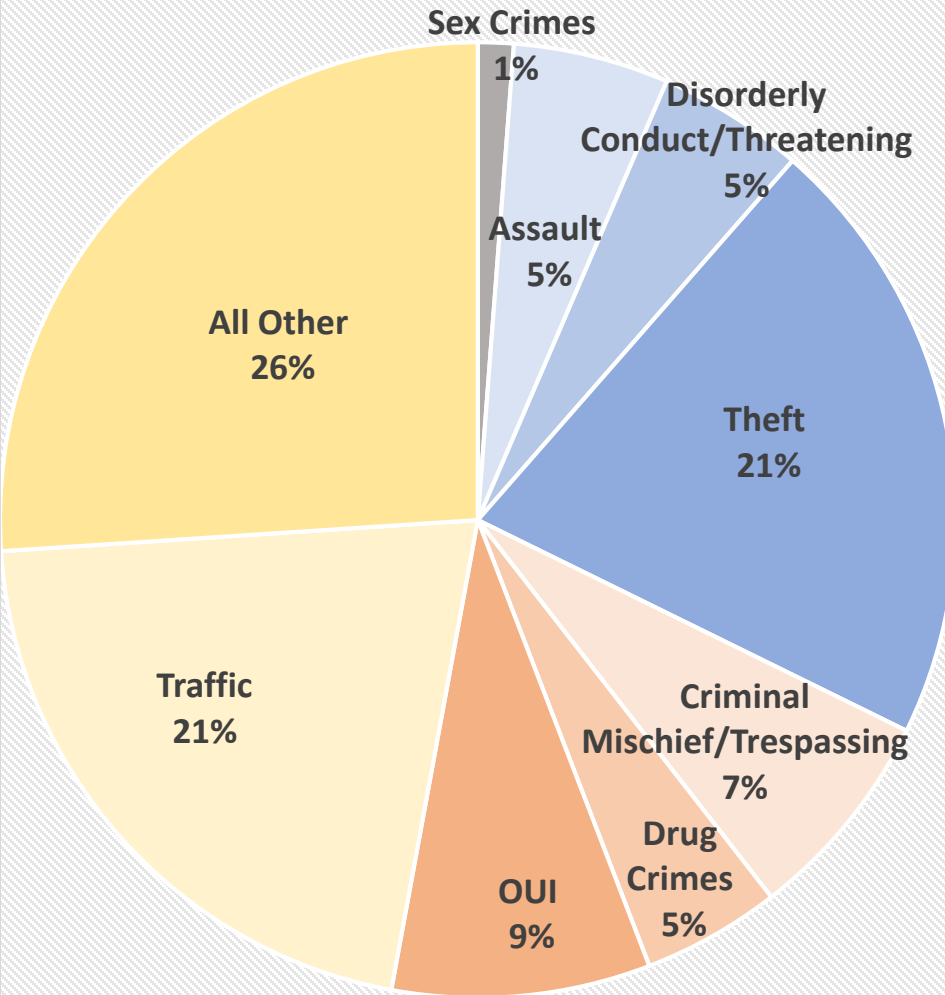

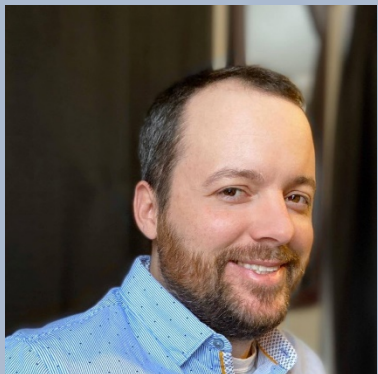
➤ CHILD

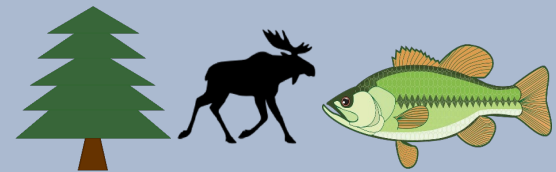
New Programs – 2021

- Engage community stakeholders





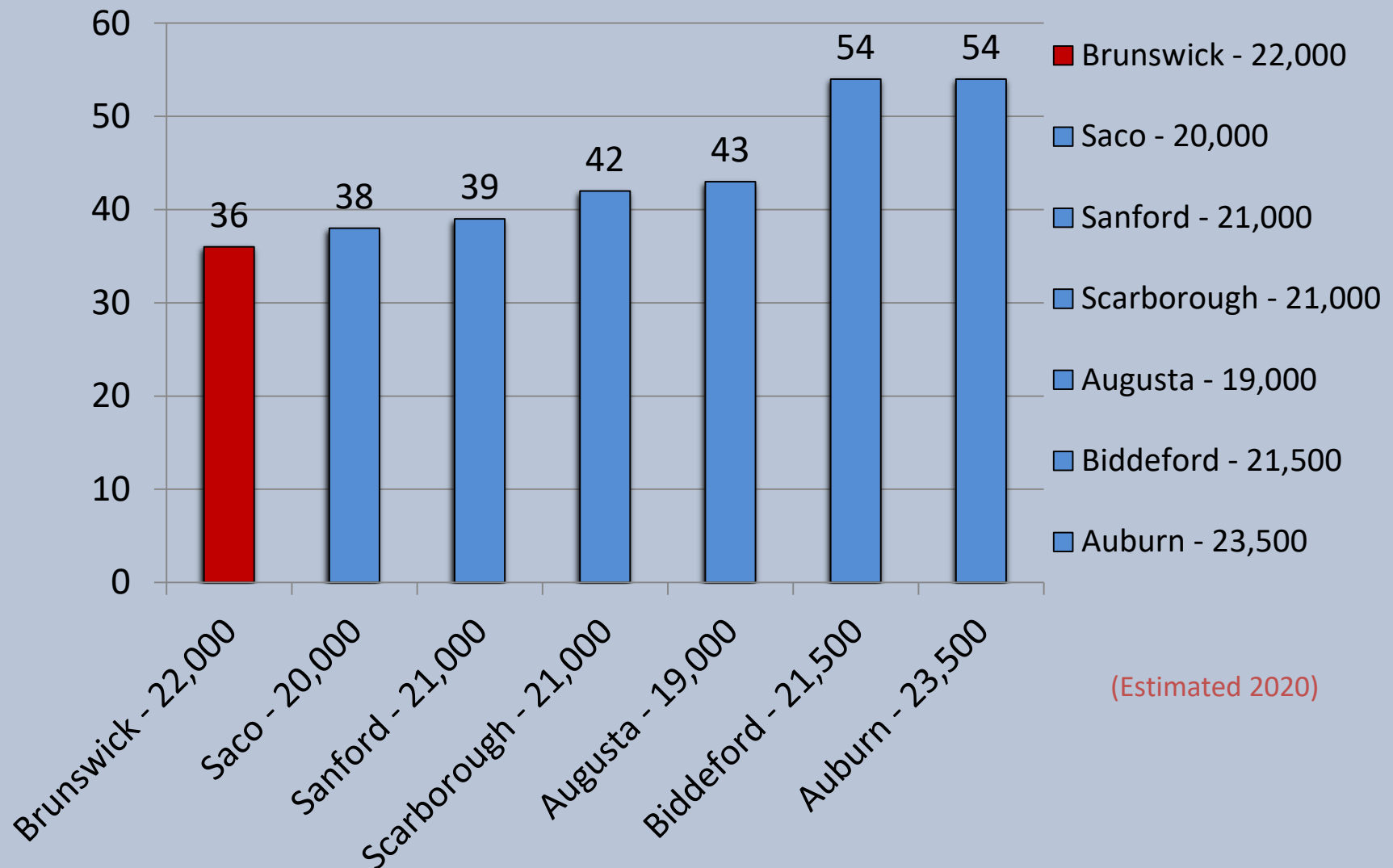
Maine Accreditation Program (MLEAP)



- Overseen by the Maine Chiefs of Police Association
- Voluntary process where police agencies prove their compliance with Maine Law Enforcement's current "Best Practices and Standards"
- 162 identified "Standards"
- Submit proofs of compliance
- Site visits by MLEAP assessors
- Currently only 6 agencies in Maine



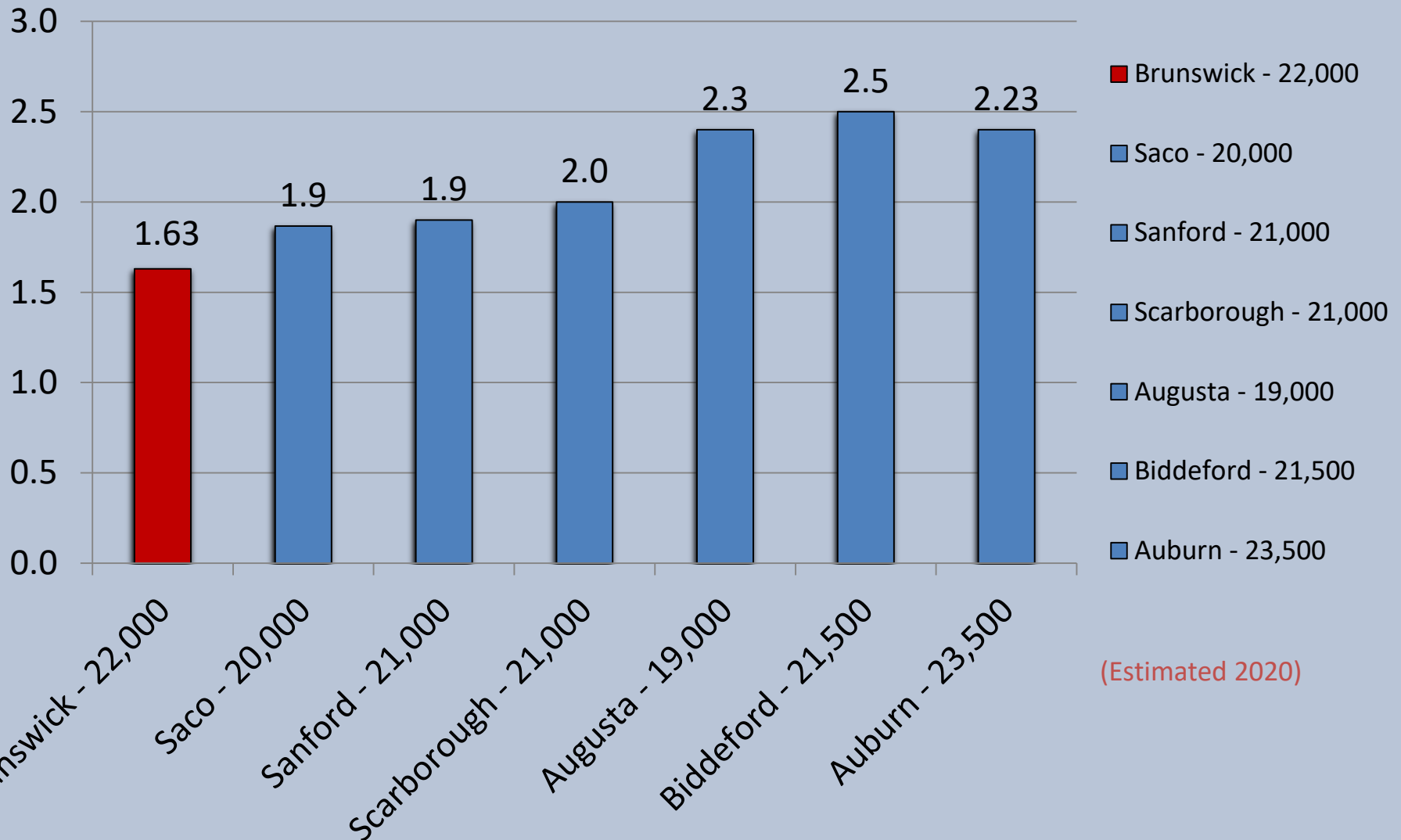
Fulltime Officers – Comparison of Brunswick w/ Similar Municipalities

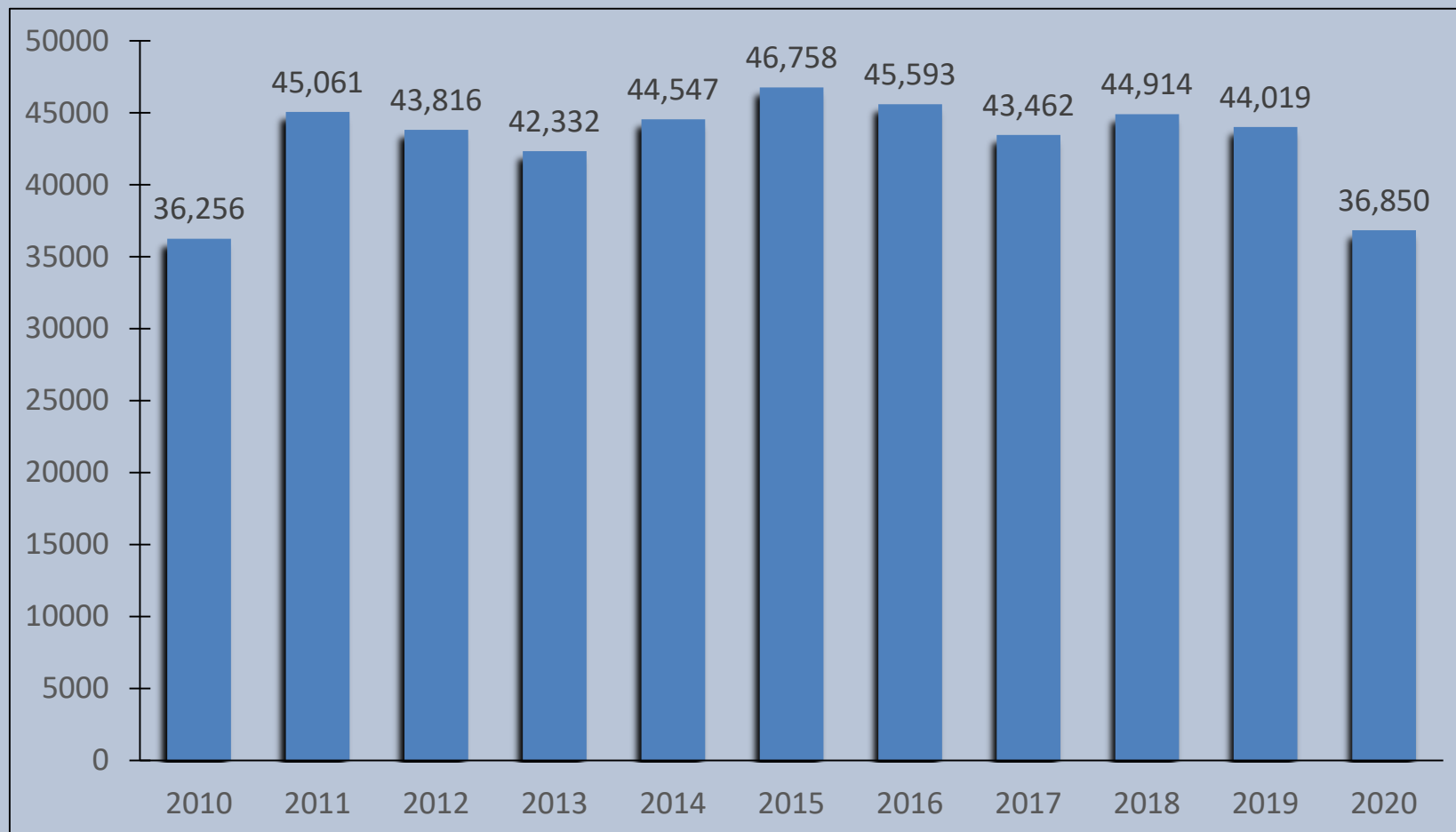
